Copp School accepts an obligation to comply with all relevant environmental legislation and to minimise its impact upon the environment.

- minimising waste and recycling materials wherever possible
- turning off taps to prevent water wastage
- keeping doors closed where possible to prevent heat loss
- maximising efficient use of our natural resources, eg solar panels
- minimising energy use in all areas of our work, eg switching off lights and computers
- promoting conservation in our local area
- purchasing environmentally friendly materials wherever possible
- educating our pupils through modelling behaviour, responsibility, pupil voice and whole school targets
- involving parents and families in protecting the environment eg through less paper use.

Regular checks and reviews are carried out to ensure that the environmental management system remains effective.

We aim to continuously improve our environmental performance through the support and involvement of all teachers, staff, pupils, governors, families, volunteers and other interested parties.
