Children had a trial run of crossing a pretend road on our school MUGA, looking left and right and remembering to walk sensibly across the road when nothing is coming.

CARBON MONOXIDE WORKSHOP

Today and tomorrow, classes within school will have some important information shared with them about carbon monoxide safety. We started our morning this morning with a whole-school assembly which will be followed up with some more in-depth learning across school in Y2, Y3, Y5 and Y6. Carbon monoxide (CO) is a colourless, odourless, and poisonous gas that can be produced by faulty or poorly maintained boilers, fires, cookers, and other fuel-burning appliances. Because it cannot be seen, smelled, or tasted, it is often referred to as the "silent killer."

Talking to children about carbon monoxide safety helps them understand the importance of recognising alarms and knowing what to do in an emergency. Working together, we can help keep everyone safe.
